



Chicago Alumni Memorial Scholarship

2006-2007 Academic Year Application

The alumni of Seton Hall University who now reside in the Chicago area have established a scholarship fund to commemorate the vision, efforts and leadership provided by the founding members of our local association. In particular to honor the work of David J. Evans and in the memory of: Kenneth J. Battista, Richard Macali and William B. Mellett. These awards are limited in number and amount but are intended to provide as much financial support as possible for those students who wish to take part in the rich tradition that Seton Hall offers them: a Catholic university with small classes, caring faculty and outstanding academic programs.

Awards will be made on the following criteria:

1. **Students must have a permanent home address in the state of Illinois at the time of filing.**
2. **Students must be entering Seton Hall University as first-time freshmen for the fall 2006 semester.** A completed application for admission, including an official high school transcript, official standardized test scores, essay, recommendations and counselor evaluation must be on file at Seton Hall University by the deadline date for this scholarship, stated below.
3. **Students must have an unweighted cumulative grade point average of 3.0.** This is calculated by Seton Hall University on a 4.0 scale.
4. **Students must have a minimum SAT I score of 1100 (or the equivalent ACT score of 23).**
5. **Financial need is a top consideration among those otherwise qualified by the requirements above.** Preference will be given to students who demonstrate financial need as a result of filing a complete and accurate 2006-2007 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
6. **Statement of purpose will be considered.** Students must submit a one-page typed essay of no more than 400 words, stating why they want to attend Seton Hall and why this scholarship will be important to meeting their educational goals.

Chicago Alumni Scholarships may be used toward any direct expenses payable to Seton Hall University (tuition, fees, room and board) and may be combined with other awards, provided the total of all grants and scholarships does not exceed the total of all direct expenses. Renewal for a second year of studies will be considered but is not automatic; it is dependent on the amount of funds available and the relative need of those students who continue to attend Seton Hall, as well as new applicants. To be considered for renewal, students must maintain full-time enrollment, a cumulative 3.0 GPA and continue to demonstrate high financial need each year through the submission of a complete and accurate FAFSA.

A limited number of these scholarships will be matched by Seton Hall University grants. When students are notified of the decision of the committee, the eligibility for matching funds will be explicitly stated.

Students must submit a completed application form and one-page essay by **February 1, 2006** to:
