### PERSPECTIVES ON A CATHOLIC PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION: ACTION AND DIRECTION FOR THE 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY

This workshop will continue our discussion of a Catholic philosophy of education in the context of historicity and the current milieu, with some questions for the future. As all education, Catholic education is the quest to understand humankind and the rest of the world as given in nature or as shaped by humankind; but, distinctively, Catholic education also seeks to understand the transcendent and the divine. (The Characteristics of Catholic Education, Seton Hall University).

At the workshop, speakers will include Toth/Lonergan Visiting Professor Mark Miller and Fr. Gerard Whelan from the Gregorian University. Praxis Program Peer Leaders will co-facilitate. Praxis Program participants will speak about aspects of a Catholic philosophy of education that have evolved from their understanding of the meaning of the University's mission, applied to their disciplines and professions, through their ATMs (Application of The Method of Bernard Lonergan).

This discussion has become foundational to the meaning of the University's mission, approached as the intellectual conversion/transformation that occurs there, with faculty and administrators as "the carriers of meaning." The workshop will provide some historical background on the topic and the opportunity to discuss action and direction for the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
