1. **Be Attentive:** Go back and remember the first day at work or the first day of school. We have had many first days throughout our school and work careers which were memorable. Why?

- 2. **Be Intelligent:** "So why are you here?" Gary Burnison's question is provocative. It points to motivation, intrinsic and extrinsic. What is yours? How have you sustained it over time?
- 3. **Be Reasonable:** As a leader, how are you engaging and enabling your colleagues and receiving direct reports to understand and activate their why? What impact might it have?
- 4. **Be Responsible:** What were key insights that surfaced in today's discussion? Any food for further contemplation? Any action steps? What are the implications for you at work, in your community and at home? Leverage the conversation for good.
