## SETON HALL OUTCOMES: SPECIFICALLY SPEAKING

Overall average starting salary for 2008 baccalaureates was \$46,600.

## CAREER-BASED EXPERIENTIAL EDUCATION TO FULL-TIME PROFESSIONAL CONVERSION OFFERS

Two out of three seniors reported having completed a career-based experiential education program (i.e. internship, clinical, practical or student teaching). Of the graduating seniors who had participated in a career-based experiential education program, 46 percent indicated that they received a full-time professional offer as a result of this experience.

## CAREER STATUS

Within six months of graduation, 82 percent of Seton Hall graduates seeking employment had accepted career-related positions. This is 10 percent higher than the national average. Stillman students have a 92 percent career-related employment rate.

## CAREER SATISFACTION

Ninety-six percent of graduates reported that they were either "very satisfied" or "satisfied" with their career-related employment.
