"Understanding love." This is the way Saint Teresa of Calcutta once explained the meaning of the Eucharist. "Christ understood," she said "that we have a terrible hunger for God. He understood that we have been created to love and so he made himself a bread of life . . . [we] must eat and drink [in the Eucharist] the goodness of the love of Christ of his understanding love."¹ Advent is a special time to experience that "terrible hunger" and longing for God—for His presence in our lives, and His enormous understanding love, the love that says: "I desire to come to you, to abide in you; I want to quench your hunger for me.
