Awards, Grants, and Honors

- ❖ Reverend Renato J. Bautista, M.Div., M.A.T., Director of Formation and Director of Seminary Records, for the Certificate in Seminary Formation for Missionary Discipleship, at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary, Boynton Beach, FL, participated in his final module (online): Module 7: "Formation Towards a Life of Discernment − Personal, Ecclesial, Pastoral," from November 4-8, 2020. Upon completion of this module, Father Bautista received his Certificate in Seminary Formation for Missionary Discipleship.
