# **Administrative Assignment**

On March 27, 2023, the Archdiocese of Newark and Seton Hall University announced that Reverend Monsignor Gerard H. McCarren, S.T.D., Interim Rector/Dean, and Associate Professor of Systematic Theology, has been appointed Rector/Dean of Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology, following a national search. Monsignor McCarren has served as Interim Rector/Dean since July 1, 2022. #### Awards, Grants, and Honors

- ❖ Justin M. Anderson, Ph.D., Professor and Chair of Moral Theology, was awarded a Seton Hall University Mission Mentors Summer Award, in collaboration with Laura Wangerin, Ph.D., Associate Professor of History, in the amount of \$4,000, for his project titled "The Triplex Veritas Translation Project." This grant was awarded for the period June 2022-May 2023. It included a University-wide, virtual presentation in April 2023, at Seton Hall University's 27<sup>th</sup> Annual Petersheim Academic Exposition, during the session on such grant projects. Approximately 15 people attended virtually. A final report is due in June 2023.
- ❖ Gregory Y. Glazov, D.Phil. (Oxon.), Professor and Chair of Biblical Studies, with Seton Hall University colleagues Minsun Lee, Ph.D. (College of Education and Human Services, Professional Psychology and Family Therapy), Anthony Haynor, Ph.D. (College of Arts and Sciences, Sociology), and Giuseppe Fazari, Ph.D. (College of Arts and Sciences, Criminal Justice), has received from Seton Hall University's Office of the Provost \$16,000, to be spent over the next three fiscal years to found an Academy for Interdisciplinary Seminar on Shame whose main goal is to publish an interdisciplinary volume of seminar papers on Shame.

Reverend Joseph R.
