• Ouestions to initiate discussion:

Be Attentive: Two articles two questions:

What has been the impact of the lives of saints in your work/life? How about Ignatius and/or Jesuit saints?

What are you noticing about your recent wage history and the wage increases at your organization and your profession/industry?

Be Intelligent: Do you see Ignatius as a management hero? Why? What insights from Michael Schuman's article caught your attention as the causes for wage stagnation?

Be Reasonable: As you reflect on your work history have you felt trusted or controlled? Has your organization been highly centralized or decentralized? What impact does knowing your people have in a centralized vs. decentralized organization?

What impact has share holder value, and it accompanying focus on efficiency had on jobs and wages and how has this ideology contributed to wage stagnation, the shrinking of the middle class and the earning gap between rank and file and CEO. Assess the role unions have played in our history in regard to wages and Michael Schulman's admonishment "We must strike a new balance between labor market flexibility and worker protection." Any thoughts?

Be Responsible: How does Psalm 65 and the concept of harvest connect to our conversation on wages, the fruit of our labor? How does Ignatius's insights on organization challenge our concepts of compensation, given his penchant for voluntary poverty? How will this conversation today impact you as you move into your work and as we move today our truly American Holiday of Thanksgiving?
