BUSINESS + LAW

This 3+3 program allows you to earn a bachelor's degree from the Stillman School of Business and transition to Seton Hall Law for three years to complete your bachelor's and earn your J.D. degree. You can choose from a variety of concentrations including economics, finance, information technology management, management, marketing or sport management.

DIPLOMACY AND INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS + LAW

This 3+3 program allows you to earn a bachelor's degree in Diplomacy and International Relations at Seton Hall University and transition to Seton Hall Law for three years to complete your bachelor's and earn your J.D. degree.
