- February 22—Last day to file course withdrawal without professor/dean approval; deadline for pass -fail and audit requests

- * **March 8**—Last day to submit course withdrawal forms with professor/dean signature
- * March 11-16—Spring Break-no classes
- * March 25—Summer 2019 registration opens
- * April 1-17—Fall 2019 registration

Compass Appointment Campaigns:

Advisers can set up appointment campaigns through Compass to remain proactive and organized throughout preregistration. To create a campaign:

- Log into Compass through PirateNet
- Select Appointment Campaigns under the Quick Links heading on the Staff Home page
- Under the Actions heading, advisers can create a new Appointment Campaign
- After designing a new campaign, advisers can send an appointment request directly to their students.
 Students will be able to access the adviser's calendar through a link in the appointment request.
- Advisers can check back on the status of their campaigns throughout preregistration, and also have the option of sending follow up messages to students.

Scholarship Reminder:

Summer and Fall 2019 PINs begin with 3- or 000Students on merit-based academic scholarships must earn a minimum 3.0 overall GPA and attempt at least 30 credits during the academic year (fall and spring semesters) in order to renew their scholarship for the following year.

Changes to Tracking Business (BART) Program:

Students transferring from other Colleges/Schools within the University to the Stillman School must meet the following requirements:

- ⇒ The student must earn at least 30 credits, of which 12 credits must have been earned at Seton Hall University.
- ⇒ The student must complete MATH1205, ECON1402, and BITM2701 with a grade of at least "C+" in each course. Students that completed MATH1401 (or equivalent) instead of MATH1205 may earn a grade of "C" in the course and still satisfy the MATH requirement. For the purpose of admission to the Stillman School, a student may take each of these courses no more than two times.
- \Rightarrow The student must achieve an average GPA of at least 2.67.
