Transfer Student Corner:

Incoming Transfer Students:

The Transfer Student Center is preparing for our fall 2017 incoming transfer students. We will need assistance from advisers across campus to advise transfer students bringing in 30 or more credits. The Transfer Student Center will begin reaching out to academic advisers for availability to schedule appointments after Easter (April 17th).

University CORE:

- Students transferring fewer than 30 credits are responsible for entire CORE (CORE 1001, CORE 1101, CORE 2101, and CORE 3xxx)
- Students transferring 30-59 credits are waived from CORE 1001 and CORE 1101, and are required to take CORE 2101 and CORE 3xxx.
- Students transferring at least 60 credits or have an Associate's Degree are waived from CORE 1001, CORE 1101, and CORE 2101. All students are required to complete CORE 3xxx.

Proficiency Requirements:

Transfer students entering the University will be required to take the following number of infused courses:

- Students entering with fewer than 30 credits must complete the full requirement of 10 infused courses by graduation.
- Students entering with 30 to 60 credits are required to complete 1/2 the number of infused courses required (5).
- Students entering with more than 60 credits are required to complete 1/3 the number of infused courses required (3).

The Transfer Student Center advisers are available to answer any questions regarding transfer students.
