
# American College of Healthcare Executives 2017 Congress on Healthcare Leadership





### **MHA Competencies**

For example, many of the concepts and terminologies taught in HCAD 7513- Healthcare Management were mentioned by the presenters. This included, "culture and how to effectively change a culture in an HCO", "patient-centered care", and "2015-2016 Baldridge Excellence Framework and Criteria." From HCAD 7518-Managing Community and Population Health, students learned about community health need assessments, the importance of utilizing data in population health, and community benefits. Overall many of the MHA competencies were incorporated throughout the seminar.
