Students will study the Church's historical and systematic teachings on sexuality through Scriptures, lectures, films, and case studies. Through their findings, students will develop an appreciation of the Catholic view of human sexuality. Topics that will be covered in this course are chastity, friendship, spousal love, procreation, temperance, natural family planning, extramarital sex, masturbation, homosexuality, and birth control.

Rev. Anthony Mastroeni, J.D., S.T.L, S.T.D., was ordained for the diocese of Paterson, NJ in 1972. HE earned an S.T.L. in Spiritual Theology, a doctorate in Moral Theology from the Angelicum in Rome; a J.D. in Civil Law from Rutgers Law School; and an M.A. in Psychology from Seton Hall University. For more than 33 years, he has been teaching university students, as well as giving retreats, mostly to consecrated women. From 1978-1985 he taught theology and philosophy at the University of San Francis's St. Ignatius Institute. From 1990-1999 he taught at the Franciscan University of Steubenville, with four years service spent at the University's campus in Gaming, Austria, as well as The International Pontifical Institute for Marriage and the Family in Gaming. He has taught theology and directed the chaplaincy at Christendom College in Front Royal, Viriginia as was the founding director of Christendom's Rome campus.
