Program Eligibility and Participant Requirements

Participants should be aware that the trip will involve:

- Adapt to different diet: traditional Chinese cuisine
- Ability to self-navigate (i.e. travel throughout the city/ sites and/or use public transportation independently, etc.)
- Travel on public buses, which are not accessible
- Exposure to high temperatures and/or humidity
- Visiting sites only accessible by stairs
