## **GUEST TICKET DISTRIBUTION INFORMATION**

Graduate Commencement and Hooding Ceremony May 16, 2019 / 6:00 p.m. / Walsh Gymnasium

In order to ensure the safety and comfort for all in attendance, each graduating student will be allowed to invite a maximum of four (4) guests to the ceremony and reception. All guests must present a ticket to gain admission.

## **Picking Up Your Guest Tickets:**

- From Wednesday, April 3, through Wednesday, April 17, 2019, tickets will be available for pick-up from your Department Secretary or Program Coordinator during regular business hours (8:45 a.m. to 4:45 p.m.) unless otherwise informed by your program.
  - Note: <u>MHA students</u> will receive separate correspondence from Ms. Patricia Edwards,
     Program Coordinator, about how and when to obtain their tickets.
- Students must pick-up tickets in person.
- We strongly encourage students to pick up their own tickets. However, if necessary, a student may pick up tickets for another student, but must bring that student's SHU ID Card.
- If you do not need all 4 tickets allotted to you, you can either:
  - give the un-needed tickets to another graduating student on your own accord, or,
  - return the un-needed tickets to your Department Secretary or Program Coordinator. We ask
    that you return un-needed tickets by April 17, so that they can be offered to other students
    who would very much like to have them (see page 2 for information on the lottery system
    that will be used).
- Any tickets that are returned by April 17 will be made available to students who request them through an online lottery system (see page 2).
  - Note: If tickets are not picked up by April 17, they will not be forfeited. Only tickets that
    explicitly are returned as "un-needed" will be offered to other students through this lottery.
- Graduating students do not need a ticket.

## **Requesting Additional Tickets:**

- An online form (link TBA, via email) will be used to collect the names of students requesting extra
  tickets (beyond the 4 they receive), if any become available. The form will be accessible from April 317.
- During the week of April 22, the SHMS Dean's Office will conduct a 'random drawing' lottery to
  determine who will receive the extra tickets, if any are available. The process will be a random
  drawing using the form submissions; therefore, it does not matter when the student fills out the
  form during the April 3-17 time period.
- We do not know how many (if any) extra tickets will be available. Therefore, students requesting extra tickets will enter their name and email address only.

## **Additional Information:**

- Wheelchair Accessible Seating: Students whose guests use wheelchairs or other mobility chairs may request, in advance, seats for those individuals in a designated, accessible area of the Walsh Gym.
  - For each guest needing an accessible seat, s/he will also be able to have 1 (one) companion sit with him/her. A "wheelchair/companion seat pass" will indicate access to this area.
  - Students requesting wheelchair/companion seats will be able to pick-up the "passes" from the Department Secretary along with their admission tickets.
  - These seats are <u>not</u> in addition to each student's allotment of 4 ceremony tickets for guests.
  - The wheelchair/companion seats will not be reserved by name they will be available in a designated and monitored area, but we must know the total # in advance so that we can accommodate. For others in the party, "general admission" seats are first-come, first-serve within the Walsh Gym, and will not be guaranteed in the same area as the wheelchair/companion seats.
  - Disability Support Services: Individuals who have a disability and will be attending the ceremony should also call Seton Hall Disability Support Services at (973) 313-6003 for information on accessible parking, access to the Recreation Center, and other accommodations that may be necessary or available.
- Children Attending the Ceremony: All individuals attending the ceremony must have a ticket, unless they are a child under 2 years-of-age who will be sitting on a parent/guardian's lap. Strollers will need to be placed in the back of the gym and cannot be left in aisles, due to fire safety regulations.
- **Doors Open:** The Walsh Gym will open for seating at 4:15 p.m. All guests must be seated by 5:45 p.m. The ceremony will begin promptly at 6:00 p.m.
