### Five-Year B.S. / M.A. Program in Diplomacy and International Relations

Seton Hall's accelerated B.S./M.A. program in Diplomacy and International Relations allows students at the School of Diplomacy to earn both a bachelor's and a master's degree in a five-year course of study.

#### **ACCELERATED PROGRAM BENEFITS**

- Complete your undergraduate and graduate degree in a total of 5 years
- Save the costs associated with one year of room and board plus 18 UG credits
- Enhance your professional development as you transition from undergraduate to graduate coursework with consistent mentorship from professors who are familiar with your goals and interests
- Solidify your career path with professional internships at both the undergraduate and graduate level
- Eliminate the necessary study time and costs of completing graduate admission testing and applications

#### **CURRICULUM**

The total number of credits required for the B.S./M.A. program is 147, with 102 at the undergraduate level and 45 at the graduate level. Under this program model, the traditional requirements for the bachelor's degree are reduced by 18 credits to accommodate the accelerated timetable.

#### **APPLY**

Undergraduate Seton Hall Diplomacy students who have completed a minimum of 66 credit hours are eligible to apply. Acceptance is contingent upon submission of an application to the Office of Graduate Admissions, and earning an overall GPA of 3.2 or higher through the end of the first semester of their junior year. Accepted students begin the M.A. program in the fall of their fourth year.
