Happenings at the Chesterton Institute

The G. K. Chesterton Institute for Faith & Culture, based at Seton Hall University, South Orange, N.J., was founded in 1974 by Father Ian Boyd. The purpose of the Institute is to promote the thought of G. K. Chesterton and his circle and, more broadly, to explore the application of Chestertonian ideas to the contemporary world through social and economic projects, lectures and seminars.

Father Boyd, along with Professor Dermot Quinn, Associate Editor of *The* Chesterton Review, and Gloria Garafulich-Grabois, Director of the Institute and Managing Editor of *The* Chesterton *Review*, organized and participated in the 2019 programme. This note brings a brief report about their work this year, as well as information about programmes and projects that are a reality because of the support of Seton Hall University and the friends of our Institute.

In 2019 the G. K. Chesterton Institute held various programs in the United States, such as Dramatic Readings of *The Man Born to be King, The Secret of the Curé of Ars*—both at Seton Hall University, and *The Parting of Friends*, at Alderton House in New York. An International Conference in Zagreb, Croatia on the topic of "Croatia in the Modern World," held in collaboration with the Catholic University of Croatia. The Institute continues to co-sponsor with Campus Ministry at Seton Hall University a Spanish Mass for the university community on the first Wednesday of the month.

The Institute also published its 45th volume of *The Chesterton Review* that comes out in June and in December of each year.

We are preparing our schedule of programmes and events for 2020 which will be announced after the New Year.

The Chesterton Review

The G. K. Chesterton Institute for Faith & Culture is based at Seton Hall University, South Orange, N.J. Its purpose is to promote the thought of G. K. Chesterton and his circle and more broadly, to explore the application of Chestertonian ideas in the contemporary world. The Institute's work, in addition to publishing *The Chesterton Review*, consists of conferences, lecture series and research.

The Chesterton Review, founded in 1974, has been widely praised both for its scholarship and for the quality of its writing. Edited by Father lan Boyd, it includes a wide range of articles, not only on Chesterton himself, but also on the work of other writers. It has devoted special issues to C. S. Lewis, George Bernanos, Hilaire Belloc, Maurice Baring, Christopher Dawson, Cardinal Manning, J. R. R. Tolkien, Fantasy Literature, a Special Polish Issue, an issue on the Easter Uprising of 1916 and the Spring/Summer 2018 Special Agrarian Issue. As the interest in Chesterton continues to grow around the world, so do our publications, which now appear in annual editions in Spanish, Portuguese, French and Italian.


The Fall/Winter 2019 issue is a "Special Croatian Issue."



Saint John Vianney, *The Curé of Ars,* was born at the beginning of the French Revolution, which made a sincere effort to extinguish the Catholic Church in France. According to playwright Henri Gheon, "there we find the man who saved souls, and the price he paid, and the countless souls he saved. The play was acted at Ars over a space of thirty years, and at exactly the same time, with all the threads in the hands of one poor priest."

Gheon conversationally painted a portrait of an almost obscure figure who managed to create a saintly image of a humble cure. During his dramatic reading of Gheon's work, Dr. McGlone will reveal *The Secret* of the Curé of Ars.





Dr. James McGlone, Professor Emeritus of Catholic Studies and Communications, will present a reading of Dorothy L. Sayers, <u>The Man Born to be King.</u>

The event is free an open to the public

When Dorothy L. Sayers began her twelve radio play-cycle on the life or our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, entitled *The Man Born To Be King*, she confronted a literally unique and extraordinary condition; there were no modern precedents to offer a guide as to treatment. Without any apparent standards for comparison, and in the face of the strenuous objections from some quarters to any theatrical presentation of the Gospel story, some would suggest that we should avoid the material. Nonetheless, tonight we have chosen to adapt that part of Sayers' drama that deals with the action of Holy Thursday and beyond.

Let Dorothy Sayers speak for us. "I am a writer and I know my trade; and I say that this story is a very great story indeed, and deserves to be taken seriously. I say further that in these days it is seldom taken seriously. It is often taken, and treated, with a gingerly solemnity; but that is what honest writers call frivolous treatment. . . . let me tell you, good Christian people, an honest writer would be ashamed to treat a nursery tale as you have treated the greatest drama in history: and this in virtue, not of his faith, but of his calling. You have forgotten, perhaps, that it is, first and foremost, a story - a true story, the turning point of history, 'the only thing that has ever really happened.' If so, the humblest in our kind may venture to put you in mind of it - we the playwright and the players - because it is our craft to tell stories, and that is the only craft we know. We have done what we could; may the Master Craftsman amend all."

The gifted lady has spoken, I think, for poor players everywhere. We are aware of our limitations, and ask your indulgence in our humble but rehearsed presentation of *The Man Born To Be King*.
