

TO TAKE A PLACEMENT TEST FOR A LANGUAGE NOT OFFERED AT SETON HALL:

- 1) Go to Language Proficiency Testing in 120+ Languages | LTI (languagetesting.com)
- 2) On the home page—under where it says "Certify language skills anytime, anywhere" (see screenshot)—select your preferred language from the drop down menu and click "Get Certified"



- 3) On the next page to "Choose or Schedule a test" you will choose from the RIGHT side of the page under Students/Teachers
- 4) Scroll down and select the third option "General Proficiency ACTFL" (see screenshot)



5) On the next page, select the Speaking test. **Note** the information in "Learn More," which states: "The Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) measures your ability to speak in a language. It is a live, unscripted, 15-30 minute phone conversation with a Certified ACTFL Tester. It must be scheduled in advance by selecting possible dates and times during the ordering process."



- 6) Click "Continue to Schedule" and on the next page, you will fill in the information needed to schedule your 30-minute proctored exam. After you fill in your info, click "Next" to go to the page to create an account or login.
- 7) Continue to follow the prompts until you need to enter your payment information. Follow all instructions and look for email correspondence with LTI about next steps.
- 8) IMPORTANT: Once you receive your test results, you must send them to the Global Learning Center. Email languageplacement@shu.edu or write directly to the GLC Director at jessica.wilson1@shu.edu. You will be informed of the final decision for your language requirements within about one week (business days).
