

Course Description: This course will introduce students to homiletics and also engage them in the process of Biblical preaching, with attention to its pastoral function. Emphasis on organization, composition, and delivery will be made. Evaluations of several homilies preached to the class are made in this course as well.

Course Explanation: The course will give students the opportunity to look at the theology, tradition and practice of Catholic preaching. In addition to the principles of biblical interpretation, catechesis, and communications theory, the course will aid students to examine particular questions, issues and challenges in homiletics from a Catholic perspective, survey the development of preaching throughout Church history, and articulate the characteristics and practice of good preaching.

Rev. Krzysztof Maslowski, S.T.D., Adjunct Professor of Pastoral Theology, is pastor of St. Joseph the Carpenter's Church in Roselle, N.J. He has a Licentiate in Sacred Theology from the Catholic University of Lublin with a concentration on Homiletics and Oral Communication.
