

In this biblical studies course, students are introduced to the scholarly study of the Gospel of John, with a view also to its use in the liturgy and pastoral ministry. The historical background, literary structure, recurrent themes, and theology of the Gospel are discussed, with special attention given to its Christology and Sacramental Theology. Numerous passages from the Gospel are considered through more detailed exegesis, using contemporary methods of biblical interpretation. The Johannine Epistles (1, 2, and 3 John) and the Book of Revelation are also explored.

Rev. Pablo Gadenz, S.S.L., S.T.D., Associate Professor of Biblical Studies, received an S.S.L. from the Pontifical Biblical Institute and an S.T.D. from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. Among his research interests are the use of the Old Testament in the New Testament and the theological interpretation of Scripture, building bridges between exegetical study and the Church's theology and liturgy.
