What is Middle States Accreditation?

Regional accrediting body (525 institutions)

- Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE)
 accreditation is an expression of confidence in an institution's
 mission and goals, its performance, and its resources.
- An institution is accredited when the educational community has verified that its goals are achieved through self-regulation and peer review.

Standard VI: Planning, Resources, and Institutional Improvement

•planning processes, resources, and structures aligned and sufficient to fulfill mission and goals

- continuous assessment of programs and services with an eye to improvement
- effective response to opportunities and challenges.



Standard VII: Governance, Leadership, and Administration

•Governance and administration allows for realization of stated mission and goals

Institution has education as its primary purpose and operates as an academic institution with appropriate autonomy.



Standard VII: Governance, Leadership, and Administration

- 2. governing body that:
 - (a) has a fiduciary responsibility for the institution, and is ultimately accountable for the academic quality, planning and fiscal well-being of the institution;
 - (f) appoints and regularly evaluates the performance of the Chief Executive Officer;

5. periodic assessment of the effectiveness of governance, leadership, and administration.



Requirement of Affiliation

12. The institution's governing body is responsible for the quality and integrity of the institution and for ensuring that the institution's mission is being accomplished.
