Further study of New Testament Greek vocabulary and grammar, focusing on more advanced verb tenses and moods. Reading, translation, and analysis of passages from the New Testament. Prerequisite: BIBL 3106.

Gregory Glazov D.Phil. (Oxon.), *Associate Professor of Biblical Studies* received an M.Phil. and a D.Phil. in Jewish Studies in the Graeco-Roman World from Oxford University, and he specializes in Old Testament Studies and in Second Temple Literature. His courses include *Jewish Roots of Christian Spirituality*, *New Testament Greek I and II*, *Prophetic Literature*, *Pentateuch*, *Wisdom Literature and Psalms* and *The Four Loves and Family Life*. Currently he is completing three books: *Brothers in Hope: Models of Judaism in Catholic Perspective* (Notre Dame), *The Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be and the Sign of the Cross*, and an annotated translation of and commentary on Vladimir Solovyov's writings on Judaism.
