CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

Msgr. Robert T. Sheeran will complete his fifteenth year as President of Seton Hall University in the coming summer. These have been years of growth and development for the University, including the addition of a new college, the Whitehead School of Diplomacy and International Relations. Msgr. Sheeran led the University community through the dark and tragic days following the Boland Hall fire on January 19, 2000, a time when it was evident that his priesthood provided a key component to his leadership.

The Department of Jewish-Christian Studies is grateful to Msgr. Sheeran for the consistent support that he gave to our academic program and related work over these years!

On January 20, 2010 Msgr. Sheer an and I reminisced about: His memories of Msgr. Oesterreicher's reports to the University community in 1965 about the Second Vatican Council and the declaration on the Church's relation to non-Christian religions (Nostra Aetate);

Reading *The Anguish of the Jews* by Father Edward H. Flannery, then a member of Seton Hall's Institute of Judaeo-Christian Studies.

His visits to Israel (1971, 1984, 1991, and May 2008).

The last visit, with members of the Sister Rose Thering Endowment under the leadership of Mrs. Luna Kaufman, coincided with the sixtieth anniversary of the State of Israel. On this occasion the work of Sister Rose Thering was commemorated at Yad Vashem.

Msgr. Sheer an took a keen interest in the planning for the Cooperman-Ross Chair in the Department and in the selection of Rabbi Alan Brill as its first research professor.

What does the future hold for this youthful sexagenarian? Msgr. Sheer an will enjoy a well-earned sabbatical in 2010-11; a portion of this time may be spent at the Ecumenical Institute at Tantur, near Jerusalem, with its opportunities for interreligious dialogue and for study of the Bible in the Land.

ROBERT A. HERRERA R.I.P.

When Dr. Robert A. Herrera died on November 25, 2009, the Institute of Judaeo-Christian Studies has lost a good friend and long-time member of its Advisory Board. The Department of Jewish-Christian Studies will miss a fellow professor and collaborator in our academic pursuits.

Robert Herrera, a doctoral student of the famous Professor Hans Jonas of the New School for Social Research in Manhattan, was a member of Seton Hall's Department of Philosophy for thirty years. He was convinced of the benefits coming from interdisciplinary work, so he joined us in Jewish-Christian Studies for many of our courses. A number of the term papers that he wrote became publications in several journals. He taught courses for us on Christian Mysticism and Spinoza. He edited *Mystics of the Book*: Themes, Topics and Typologies (New York: Peter Lang, 1993), drawing on his contacts with scholars from several nations. His other books

provide evidence of his wide-ranging research interests

After retiring in 1998 Dr. Herrera continued to publish books on a variety of topics and persons. May he enjoy the eternal reward of a scholar who, like St. Anselm, was devoted to the wedding of faith and reason! May his soul rest in peace!

Participated in the US conference of Catholic Bishops Dialogue with the Council of Synagogues on November 11,2009 at Jewish Theological Seminary in New York.


Gave a presentation "the Sacrament of Confirmation and the Holy Spirit" to the Seton Hall RCIA group on February 14, 2010.

TUITION SCHOLARSHIP ASSISTANCE

Many worthy students who show an interest in Jewish-Christian Studies cannot afford to pay the level of tuition charged by Seton Hall University. From the first semester of our program in 1975 the Foundation for Judaeo-Christian Studies has provided assistance for a number of matriculated students. In 1990 the Sister Rose Thering Endowment was envisioned to assist educators who wish to take one or more courses in the program, especially in relation to the Shoah (Holocaust). After the call

for Holocaust and Genocide Education was passed by the New Jersey Legislature and signed by Governor Christine Whitman in 1994, many teachers have received tuition assistance to respond to this mandate. Of course, teachers and others in our Master's program should seek assistance from their school district or other sources because funds from these two sources are limited.

Recently a Holocaust survivor and a resident of South Orange, Mrs. LilyiRichman, included a generous sum in her will for the support of students at Seton Hall University. This bequest has become a quasiendowment, designated the Andrew-Lili Richman Scholarship, to benefit full-time students in Jewish-Christian Studies, beginning in the Fall 2010 semester. This gift will open the door for one or two students to receive assistance for the bulk of tuition for one or two courses. We are indeed grateful for this gift!
