Course Description: A systematic and historical examination of the doctrine of the Triune God: dialectical nature of God as both hidden and revealed, immanent and transcendent; attributes and perfections of God; Patristic and Conciliar debates about the nature of the Trinity; persons, processions, relations and missions within the Godhead; speculation in relation to the "economic" and "immanent" Trinity, as well as contemporary retrievals of psychological analogies.

Reverend Roberto Ortiz, S.T.L., Formation faculty member and Adjunct Professor of Systematic Theology, is from Jersey City, NJ. Archbishop John Joseph Myers ordained him a priest for service in the Archdiocese of Newark on May 23, 2009. Father Ortiz earned a B.A. in Catholic Studies from Seton Hall University in 2005. He earned his Licentiate in Sacred Theology from the Gregorian University in 2010, specializing in Dogmatic (Systematic) Theology. His first parish assignment was as a parochial vicar at St. Elizabeth Parish in Wyckoff from 2010 to 2012. In September 2012, he was appointed to the formation faculty and serves as Adjunct Professor of Systematic Theology.
