August 2 - Tuition bill due (if not enrolled in a payment plan)

Other Things to Remember Before the Fall...

- Submit health forms and immunization records to health services
- Submit your AP or IB scores to the Office of Admissions
- Submit the online FERPA authorization form on PirateNet (this allows your parents to discuss your records with SHU)
- Add your parents as authorized users on your Bursar account so they can view and pay your bill and set up payment plans
- Accept your financial aid awards in PirateNet and complete your loan entrance interview (if applicable)
- Waive your health insurance by Sept. 4 or you will receive and pay for university-issued health insurance
