Seton Hall Sports Poll on Bonds Perjury Trial, NCAA Tournament

NATION BELIEVES BONDS CASE SHOULD HAVE BEEN DROPPED EVEN THOUGH THEY THINK HE IS GUILTY

FANS LOVE NEW NCAA BROADCAST FORMAT

S. Orange, NJ, March 31, 2011 – A Seton Hall Sports Poll conducted this week shows that while 74% of Americans think Barry Bonds knowingly took performance enhancing drugs, (PEDs), 62% feel that the case should have been dropped.

The sentiment is a little more sympathetic to Bonds among African-Americans. Eighty-two percent of African-Americans say the case should have been dropped (vs. 58% for whites), while 62% of African-Americans believe he knowingly took PEDs (vs. 78% for whites). The poll, conducted among 747 people, has a +/- margin of error of 3.6%, which is larger for the smaller number of African-American respondents.

Fifty-two percent of respondents feel media coverage of Bonds has been fair, with no significant difference between whites and African Americans.

The poll shows that 30% maintain some or high interest in the trial, currently taking place in San Francisco, while 65% say they have little or no interest in the story.

"Since the trial has it all – sex, drugs, and celebrity – it's interesting to see that two out of three respondents have little or no interest," noted Rick Gentile, director of the poll, which is conducted by The Sharkey Institute. "This remains consistent with our polls from when he was still an active player."

Meanwhile, a huge 81% said television coverage by four networks, allowing games to be shown in their entirety, was an improvement on the way it has been presented in the past.

Only 12% say they have watched any live coverage on the Internet.

An overwhelming 82% feel that college basketball programs break rules in recruiting athletes (either some, most or all of the schools), and 60% say it hurts the game when colleges recruit athletes they know won't stay for their full eligibility. This is consistent with previous polls asking the same questions.

A large majority of people support Education Secretary Arne Duncan's belief that tournament-eligible teams should graduate 40% of its players, and 59% (up from 52% last year), think the percentage should be even higher.

A large number - 23% of Americans – almost one in four – believe that college basketball players intentionally influence the outcome of games because of gambling interests.

"This," says Gentile, "remains an alarmingly high number of people who think the games are cooked. Yet there is apathy about it for reasons that are hard to understand."
