#### GOP HOLDS ITS OWN VS. NFL AND MLB

#### Seton Hall Sports Poll Finds No Call for NCAA Oversight on Conference Shifting

#### 60% Want More Replays in Baseball

S. Orange, NJ, September 22, 2011 – The contest for the Republican presidential nomination has captured the interest of Americans on a par with the NFL and MLB, according to a poll by the Seton Hall Sports Poll, conducted this week.

34% cited the GOP race as the one they were most interested in, compared to 35% citing the NFL season and 20% the MLB post-season. Even among those who follow sports, 28% cited the Republican contest as most interesting to them.

The poll was conducted among 959 randomly dialed people across the country with a margin of error of 3%, (and an error of 4% among those who follow sports).

Without the GOP option, football doubled baseball 54%-27% with 18% expressing no interest in either.

"It will be while before the GOP candidates get into the red zone," said Rick Gentile, director of the poll, which is conducted by The Sharkey Institute. "But the field at the moment, sorting itself out, seems to have provided Americans with a competition that's produced strong interest, even stacked against the two biggest sports leagues in the country."

Meanwhile, the poll found the nation is evenly divided over whether NCAA should get involved in the switching of conference membership by colleges. The conference jumping, the subject of much attention recently, did not find a majority looking for NCAA oversight, with 32% feeling the NCAA should be involved, and 33% saying no, a difference well within the margin of error. (35% had no opinion or did not care).

"This is a microcosm of almost all things about the anarchy reigning in college sports these days," said Gentile. "So many issues find a third in favor, a third opposed, and a third with no opinion. Add this to the list."

As baseball heads for its post season (with the Yankees the choice of 17% to win it all; the Phillies 10% and no one else in double digits), the issue of video replay scores high with fans, with 60% wanting to extend its use to one similar to the NFL. A much smaller number – only 30% - favors adding an extra wild card team to the playoffs.

#### **Favorable Opinions of the Four Commissioners**

While only a third of the people have clear opinions of the four major sports commissioners, those that do see them very favorably. NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell with 28% favorable, 7% unfavorable and MLB Commissioner Bud Selig with 28% favorable and 11% unfavorable lead the list. They are followed by NBA Commissioner David Stern at 23% favorable to 13% unfavorable and NHL Commissioner Gary Bettman with 19%, favorable to 4% unfavorable.

"This is impressive given their involvement over the years in divisive labor issues, drug testing and other hot button issues" said Gentile. "Politicians in both parties should be envious."
