THE HOWARD L. GREEN 2013 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

On September 29, 2002, radio and television mogul Howard L. Green passed away at the age of 72. Howard was a well known broadcaster and active citizen of the Atlantic City area. Howard started his broadcasting career as a part-time summer announcer at WENY in upstate New York. His first full-time job was at WCBA in Corning, NY. Howard moved to WAYZ in Waynesboro, PA and finally ended up in Atlantic City as General Manager of WOND, eventually owning the station. He later purchased WENY where he started, WMMB in Melbourne, FL and WJAB in Portland, ME. He then added several NJ newspapers and TV 40, WMGM-TV, the only network affiliated TV station in the state.

At the age of 29 he was inducted as the youngest President of the New Jersey Broadcasters Association and some years later became a repeat President and Chairman of the Board. His charitable commitments included the Salvation Army, Muscular Dystrophy Association, the American Cancer Society, the recordings of Holocaust survivor's testimonies and many other public services.

Longport Media is proud to present this memorial scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00 in Howard Green's name for New Jersey undergraduate students studying broadcasting, journalism or communications at a college or university in New Jersey. **Deadline** for submitting application forms and supporting materials is **April 25, 2013**. A panel of broadcasters will review all applications. The most qualified applicant will be notified in early June of his/her award.

1. A brief statement explaining their interest in broadcasting, how they expect to develop this interest and experience they have had so far in this field in high school, college or professionally.
2. A brief biography.
3. A letter of recommendation from a person qualified to judge their performance and/or aptitude for a career in broadcasting.

4. A short note from their instructor or advisor evaluating their overall academic ability.
5. Some representative sample (tape, disc, written) of their work in the field for evaluation by the judges.
