Students will have an opportunity to closely examine the notion of wisdom in the ancient Near East through study of various Psalms, and books such as Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Ben Sira and Wisdom of Solomon. Through this course, students will better understand the roots of Israel's and the Church's prayer life, and the wisdom which the scriptures bring to the spheres of everyday practical life, suffering and love.

Gregory Glazov D.Phil. (Oxon.), Associate Professor of Biblical Studies received an M.Phil. and a D.Phil. in Jewish Studies in the Graeco-Roman World from Oxford University, and he specializes in Old Testament Studies and in Second Temple Literature. His courses include Jewish Roots of Christian Spirituality, New Testament Greek I and II, Prophetic Literature, Pentateuch, Wisdom Literature and Psalms and The Four Loves and Family Life. Currently he is completing three books: Brothers in Hope: Models of Judaism in Catholic Perspective (Notre Dame), The Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be and the Sign of the Cross, and an annotated translation of and commentary on Vladimir Solovyov's writings on Judaism.
