## NEXT STEPS

### ❑ CONFIRM YOUR ENROLLMENT

Confirm your intent to enroll at Seton Hall by submitting your nonrefundable \$350 tuition deposit by May 1. You can confirm your enrollment by paying your deposit online. If you prefer to pay by check, please be sure to include your Student ID number on the check. Visit our Welcome Page, [www.shu.edu/welcome](http://www.shu.edu/welcome), for more information.

### ❑ SUBMIT HOUSING APPLICATION AND HOUSING DEPOSIT

If you plan to live in University housing, you need to submit a housing application AND a \$375 housing deposit. Housing is limited and only students who complete the housing application AND pay the housing deposit by May 1 will be eligible for housing. The housing deposit is in addition to your tuition deposit and it is nonrefundable after May 1. The fall housing application for new and transfer students will be available in February on the MCR Housing chiclet in PirateNet. Space is limited, and housing is not guaranteed. If you would like to pay by check or money order, please mail it to the Office of Admissions and include your Seton Hall ID number (from your acceptance letter) on the check. Housing assignments are made in July.

### ❑ FILE THE FAFSA

If you haven't already, please be sure to apply for financial aid by submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by January 1 or as soon as possible, and be sure to list Seton Hall's federal school code (002632). File online at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov). Financial aid awards are available on your Applicant Portal in the spring to all students who filed the FAFSA.

### ❑ ATTEND AN ADMITTED STUDENT EVENT

We offer many opportunities in the Spring for you to explore Seton Hall at events exclusively for admitted students. These include Pirate Preview, Open Houses, Visit Days, Admitted Student Information Sessions, Campus tours, and more. # Once You've Deposited, What's Next?

After you submit your nonrefundable tuition deposit, you can prepare for your life as part of the Seton Hall community by completing the following items (you can review these steps at [www.shu.edu/welcome](http://www.shu.edu/welcome)):

## ❑ ACCESS PIRATENET

PirateNet is Seton Hall's online portal. Here, you can access your placement tests, financial aid, bills, registration and more. Beginning in January, we will email you an invitation for Pirate Adventure (Summer Orientation) that will include your username and password for PirateNet. To access the portal, visit **PirateNet.shu.edu** and enter your username and password.

## ❑ CONFIRM YOUR PIRATE ADVENTURE ATTENDANCE

Once you log in to PirateNet you can confirm your attendance for Pirate Adventure, our new student orientation program for all first-year students. Students may choose from one of our two-day overnight sessions offered: June 15-16, June 17-18, June 22-23 and June 24-25.

Here is a brief overview of what you can expect from the experience.

**DAY ONE:** A snapshot of life on campus! You will meet your Orientation Leader, learn how to get involved on campus, participate in social events and activities, and immerse yourself in Seton Hall's Catholic mission and traditions. **DAY TWO:** Explore academic life! You will meet with deans and faculty from your program, register for classes with an academic advisor, and learn about the various available support services. Attending Day 2 is a requirement to ensure you are all set for the first day of classes in August. **If you have questions** about Pirate Adventure, please contact Student Engagement at [orientation@shu.edu](mailto:orientation@shu.edu).

## ❑ TAKE YOUR PLACEMENT TESTS

Students may need to take placement tests in english, math and/or foreign language in order to be placed in the correct course level. Testing is based on numerous factors, such as your major and academic performance in high school. These tests must be completed before you can register for classes at Pirate Adventure. ## ❑ SUBMIT YOUR AP OR IB SCORES

Submit AP and IB scores, and we will grant you college-level credit for AP exam scores of 4 or above and higher-level IB scores above a grade 5. If you have taken college-level courses for credit, we will grant credit for courses in which you have earned a C or better. To receive credit, have official copies of your scores and/or transcripts sent to the Office of Admissions, 400 South Orange Avenue, South Orange, NJ 07079, or emailed to [thehall@shu.edu](mailto:thehall@shu.edu).

## ❑ SUBMIT HEALTH INFORMATION

To submit your health requirements, log in to PirateNet at **PirateNet.shu.edu** and click on the "Student Health Portal" chiclet (app). Instructions are available in the portal and a video tutorial for completing the health requirements is available on the Health Services web page ([www.shu.edu/health-services](http://www.shu.edu/health-services)). ## ❑ SUBMIT HEALTH INSURANCE WAIVER

Full-time students are required to be covered by health insurance. Seton Hall automatically provides a group health insurance plan that is charged to your bill. If you already have health insurance and do not want the Seton Hall plan, you may complete an insurance waiver form at [UniversityHealthPlans.com/shu](http://UniversityHealthPlans.com/shu). The waiver will be available starting in June, and is due by September 5. If you do not submit the waiver by this date, the charge cannot be removed from your bill.

## ❑ ACCEPT YOUR FINANCIAL AID AWARDS

If you filed a FAFSA, your financial aid awards will be available on the Applicant Portal in late February. Students who have received their financial aid awards need to review and accept their awards after depositing by visiting **PirateNet.shu.edu**.

## ❑ SAVE THE DATES: MOVE-IN DAY, WELCOME WEEKEND AND FIRST DAY OF CLASSES

If you are living in University housing, New Student Move-in will be August 26-27. Move-in Day and room assignment information will be emailed to you by Residence Life in July. All students will join us August 28-30 for Welcome Weekend, a continuation of new student orientation. More information to come. Don't forget classes begin on August 31.
