### LEADERSHIP AS SERVICE IN ACTION



Dr. Andrew Simon will explore the essence of servant leadership as an expression of good and virtuous action. This presentation will emphasize that leadership is not tied to a formal role but is rooted in our ability to be fully present and responsive to the needs of others, regardless of one's position or background. By examining our own values and beliefs, we uncover barriers to genuine service, allowing us to act with greater commitment and purpose.

Dr. Simon will share insights into how self-awareness fosters meaningful connections and creates the foundation for actions rooted in integrity and the pursuit of the good. This talk will invite participants to see leadership as a way of being—one that influences others not through authority, but through the everyday choices that reflect who we are and how we serve.

Andrew F. Simon, PhD, PsyD, is Professor of Psychology and the Leadership and Professional Development Fellow at Seton Hall University. His research and consulting on leadership, team performance, and organizational effectiveness span business, government, education, and the non-profit sectors. Dr. Simon has held senior roles in executive education programs at the Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania, and served as the 2023 President of the International Council of Psychologists.
