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As a Nurse dedicated to providing the highest quality care and services, I solemnly pledge that I will:

Consider the welfare of humanity and relief of suffering my primary concerns;

Act in compassionate and trustworthy manner in all aspects of my care;

Apply my knowledge, experience and skills to the best of my ability to assure optimal outcomes for my patients;

Exercise sound professional judgment while abiding by legal and ethical requirements;

Accept the lifelong obligation to improve my professional knowledge and competence;

Promote, advocate for, and strive to protect the health, safety, and rights of the patient.

With this pledge, I accept the duties and responsibilities that embody the nursing profession.

I take this oath voluntarily with the full realization of the responsibility with which I am entrusted by the public.

Academic Integrity Oath

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I pledge to uphold the highest standards of honesty and integrity in all of my actions as a student nurse at Seton Hall University College of Nursing, and to act in accordance with the College of Nursing Academic Integrity Policy. History of the White Coat Ceremony

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The White Coat Ceremony is the oldest, and most well-known, program of the Gold Foundation. The Arnold P. Gold Foundation established the White Coat Ceremony in 1993 at the Columbia University Vagelos College of Physicians and Surgeons as a way to emphasize humanism in medicine at the very start of medical education.

In 2014, recognizing the vital role nurses play in the healthcare team, the Gold Foundation partnered with the American Association of Colleges of Nursing to adapt the ceremony for nursing.

While it may take different forms, the ceremony emphasizes the importance of humanistic patient care, defined as compassionate, collaborative and scientifically excellent healthcare, early in nursing training and professional identity formation. More than 450 schools of nursing have participated and the number continues to grow.





Seton Hall University College of Nursing offered the first baccalaureate nursing program in New Jersey in 1937.

The graduate program was established in 1975, the Ph.D. Program in 2006 and the Doctor of Nursing Practice program in 2009.

The College of Nursing's mission is to educate baccalaureate prepared generalists and advanced practitioners of nursing who aspire to be innovators and leaders in the nursing profession.



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
