M.A., Instructional Design & Technology with a Certificate in Transition Studies (36 credits)

(Includes SHU certificate in Information Technologies and SHU certificate in Transition Studies)

The online Instructional Design and Technology (IDAT) M.A. with a concentration in Transition Studies offers a unique program of study for special education teachers and guidance counselors. The combined programs bring together the most current digital age learning curriculum, tools, and strategies to maximize the learning of all students in a technology-rich environment as they transition to postsecondary opportunities. Graduates learn about, utilize, and design assistive and adaptive technologies to support youth and young adults as they transition to postsecondary opportunities.

Schools are seeking teachers with transition skills. The role of the transition specialist is to prepare students before they leave school to adapt to the life changes they will encounter after completing their formal educational program. The IDAT M.A. program with a concentration in Transition Studies gives graduates the knowledge, tools, and strategies to serve the special needs of these students and integrate digital technologies and assistive technologies throughout the transition process. 21st century technologies are the keys to motivation, engagement and learning. The IDAT with Transition studies will assist graduates to achieve the vision, mission, and goals of transition programs for individuals with exceptionalities as they transition to daily life, work, military, and/or further education.

Graduates receive a Seton Hall Certificate in Information Technologies and the Special Education Transition Certificate which is aligned with the Council for Exceptional Children (CEC) standards related to transition. Courses are taught by knowledgeable faculty engaged in transition development and services.
