

**Preventing Discrimination and Sexual Violence:**  
**Title IX, VAWA and Clery Act**  
**for Faculty, Staff, and Administrators**  
**On-line Training**

All new employees and faculty members (full and part-time) are **required** to complete this on-line course within thirty (30) days of receipt of the registration e-mail from Everfi, the University's vendor who administers the training. In order to access the training through the portal, you will need to input your last name and your Employee ID number.

This course addresses how to identify and respond to different types of sexual misconduct committed against students as required under Title IX and the Clery Act. This course also includes information on university policy, procedures and reporting protocols.
