


Mary Meehan, Ph.D. President, Seton Hall University



Mary Meehan, Ph.D., was appointed interim president of Seton Hall University on March 23, 2017. She is a nationally respected higher education and healthcare leader, as well as a former Seton Hall administrator and University alumna.

Meehan has spent more than 30 years in executive positions at higher education and healthcare institutions, including more than a decade as the first lay president of Alverno College, a leading Catholic women's college in Milwaukee, Wis.

Meehan earned her B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. at Seton Hall, as well as an M.S. in Health Policy and Management from New York Medical College. At Seton Hall, she served as Vice President and Assistant to the President from 1996 to 2001 and as Executive Vice President for Administration from 2001 to 2004.

She also has an extensive professional healthcare background, having previously served as Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer at St. Mary's Hospital in Passaic, N.J. and as Administrator and CEO of St. Vincent's Medical Center in Harrison, N.Y. Meehan is a life fellow in the American College of Healthcare Executives, and is a licensed professional mental health counselor.

Meehan has also served on national boards, most recently the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities (Vice Chair), NCAA Presidents Council, Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (Chair), Women's College Coalition and Froedtert Health System.

In addition, she has provided extensive service to the Catholic Church. She chaired the board of the Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology and served on the Review Board for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. She also chaired the Meehan Commission, a national survey of Catholic dioceses' policies regarding allegations of clergy misconduct.

Meehan has been honored with numerous awards, including the prestigious Sacagawea Award from Professional Dimensions, the Thomas More Faithful Servant Award, the Ben Franklin Award, Woman of the Year from Seton Hall University and the Outstanding Professional of the Year by both the American Rehabilitation Counseling Association and the National Rehabilitation Counseling Association.

Emmy Award-winning journalist David Novarro is one of New York's most trusted television news anchors. A native of Manhattan's Lower East Side and Queens, Novarro started his career with Eyewitness News as a college intern and rose through the ranks to become a reporter. During his career, Novarro has covered many notable news stories including the racial profiling case that led to the overhaul of the New Jersey State Police Department and the World Trade Center attack, landing a rare interview with Sheikh Omar Abdul-Rahman, convicted mastermind of the bombing.

Novarro helped launch the Eyewitness News community affairs show "Tiempo," the first public affairs program dedicated to issues of interest to the Hispanic community to air in New York City. He is very proud of his Latino roots and works hard to better his community. Novarro is a graduate of New York University. He is married and is the proud father of son Daniel.

Adriana Vargas News Anchor Univision 41 Nueva York



Adriana Vargas is an Emmy award-winning Colombian journalist and news anchor for New York's WXTV Univision 41 Nueva York with over 20 years of experience covering major worldwide events and breaking news stories.

From a young age, while still studying Social Communication and Journalism at the Universidad Javeriana in Bogotá (Colombia), she started her career as a journalist and presenter of short news sections for regional channels in Colombia. Adriana's career would go onto include roles at Señal Colombia, Caracol TV news magazine Séptimo Día, RCN TV, Noticias RCN, and opinion news magazine La noche. After briefly serving as spokeswoman and International Media Director for Colombian President Juan Manuel Santos, Vargas joined the Univision station. Today she continues to be one of the most recognized and celebrated news anchors in the New York Tri-State area for her nightly role on Noticias Univision 41 at 6pm and 11pm.

After graduating, she served as a Law Clerk in the Appellate Division of the Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office and a Judicial Term Law Clerk to the Hon. Lisa P. Thornton in the Superior Court of New Jersey. A Rutgers graduate, Arlene has served as an Adjunct Professor at New Jersey City University.


The Most Reverend Manuel A. Cruz, D.D. Auxiliary Bishop, Archdiocese of Newark



Often said to be the key to the Hispanic Catholic community in Northern NJ, Bishop "Manny," as he is affectionately known, is a prominent spiritual leader and proud Seton Hall "Pirate" alumnus.

Born in Havana, Cuba to the late Juan and Caridad Cruz, Bishop Cruz came to the U.S. in 1966 with his parents, settling in Union City, NJ. Bishop Cruz, a graduate of Seton Hall University, studied for the priesthood at Immaculate Conception Seminary, Darlington, NJ. He was ordained a priest for service in the Archdiocese of Newark on May 31, 1980 -- the first Cuban-born priest ordained in the Archdiocese.

He has served as a member of the Institutional Review Board of several hospitals, as a member of the Ethics Committee of Saint Michael's Medical Center, and as a member of the NJ Catholic Conference's Committee on Ethics, and is a lecturer in neuropathology at UMDNJ. In 2008, Pope Benedict XVI named Msgr. Cruz Titular Bishop of Gaguari and an Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Newark. His episcopal ordination was held on September 8, 2008. Today he serves in the Archdiocese as Regional Bishop of Union County, Vicar for the Archdiocese's Hispanic Apostolate, and Rector of the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart.
