On-line Training

All University employees, officers, priests, faculty (full and part time, as well as adjuncts), administrators, and staff are **required** to complete this on-line course within thirty (30) days of receipt of the registration e-mail from Vector Solutions, the University's vendor who administers the training. The email from Vector will include log-in instructions for completing the training. The course can also be accessed by logging in to PirateNet and selecting the Vector LMS app; it is recommended that you use the Google Chrome browser for the most efficient operation of the module

This training course has been developed to reflect current state and federal laws and regulations and includes a section specific to requirements under Title IX and the Clery Act. This course also includes information on University policy, procedures, and reporting protocols.
